Praying Salaat

Salaat is the first of the Furoo-e-deen.

It is our special time with Allah.

There are 17 Raka`ats in the daily prayers.

Fajr (2 rakaats), Dhor (4 rakaats),

Asr (4 rakaats), Maghrib (3 rakaats) and Eisha (4 rakaats)

Make it a rule to pray on time and regularly.
